Description:

On 1/4/2024, a Deputy from the Champaign County Sheriff's Office initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle after



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observing an Illinois Traffic Code violation. The offending vehicle fled from the Deputy. After the offender disregarded three (3) traffic control devices, the Deputy terminated the pursuit. The offender has not been located.

This incident was captured by my Axon department issued camera. This report is a summary of the statements and events that were given to me by the individual(s) I spoke to pertaining to this incident. This report is not directly quoted unless otherwise specified. The statements in this report may or may not be in chronological order as they were given to me. I did not review my body camera recording prior to authoring this report.

All parties involved in this incident were made aware of the presence of my body camera and that our interaction would be audio and video recorded.

On 1/4/2023, at approximately 1347 hours, I (Deputy Johnson) was fulfilling my regular patrol duties in the area of W Columbia Ave and N Prospect Ave in Champaign, IL. I was operating a fully marked patrol vehicle. While traveling southbound on Prospect Ave, I observed a black in color Toyota Camry stopped at the stop sign of W Columbia Ave. I observed this vehicle to not have a front license plate, as require by the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/3-413(a)).

I turned on to W Washington Ave and turned around, to see which direction the vehicle would be traveling. I observed the Camry to travel southbound on N Prospect Ave, passing my patrol vehicle. I turned on to N Prospect Ave and positioned my patrol vehicle behind the Camry. I observed the rear license plate to bear the Illinois passenger registration IL [REDACTED].

Due to the vehicles dark tint applied to all of its windows, I was unable to observe any identifying features of its driver nor observe the number of occupants it contained.

As I began to initiate my traffic stop through METCAD, the Camry slowed in speed and began to pull into a driveway, just north of the W Hill St and N Prospect Ave intersection. At this time, I activated my red, white, and blue emergency lights and completed providing METCAD with the necessary identifying information of the vehicle. The Camry came to an abrupt stop before activating its reverse lights. I then activated my siren.



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The Camry then fled south bound on N Prospect Ave before turning west bound on W Hill St. While on W Hill St, the Camry accelerated to a high rate of speed before turning south bound on N McKinley Ave. During this process, the offender disregarded the stop sign (625 ILCS 5-11/305) at W Hill St and N McKinley Ave.

The offender then crossed over W Church St, disregarding an additional stop sign. The offender turned east bound on W Park St. Continuing at a high rate of speed, the offender then turned southbound on N Prospect Ave, disregarding a third stop sign. As I turned south on to N Prospect Ave and approached a crowded W University Ave intersection, I lost sight of the vehicle. Due to this and the offenders erratic driving, I terminated the pursuit.

While pursuing this vehicle, I observed it disregard three (3) traffic control devices as well as operate a vehicle with improper display of registration.

It should be noted that I was aware that this vehicle had previously fled from the Urbana Police Department on the evening of 1/2/2024. On this night, [REDACTED] was said to be operating this vehicle. For the full details surround this incident, please reference U24-136.

The black in color 2023 Toyota Camry is registered to [REDACTED] who is registered to reside at [REDACTED]. Due to prior police contacts, I know [REDACTED] to be the mother of [REDACTED] child.

At the time of authoring this report, the vehicle, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] have not been located.

On Saturday, August 26, 2023, at approximately 1845 hours, I, Deputy Griffin #557, responded to ██████████ Champaign Twp, for a report of a burglary. The reporting party, later identified as ██████████ said a shed was broken into and approximately \$30,000.00 worth of items were stolen.

It should be noted the property owner, ██████████ previously reported copper theft from the house on the property on 08/08/2023. This incident, 2023-00019541, states there was a 7-year unknown timeframe for copper theft from the residence.

On my arrival to the scene, I observed a large outbuilding on the property. I spoke to the reporting party, ██████████ outside the building. ██████████ told me he last stored his boat on Friday, August 18, 2023, in the storage shed. He returned today to the shed and found a window on the shed broken and multiple high-end fishing supplies taken from his boat. ██████████ told me he had been inside the garage and checked the building already. ██████████ also told me there were trail cameras hung around the property, and he would work on getting the pictures from the cameras.

I then walked around the exterior of the building and noted the following observations.



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The building had a large garage door on the South side as well as a standard sized door left of the garage door. The standard door was open. I observed a power tool battery lying near the garage door, as well as two wire connectors. There was a pile of bolts and washers lying on the ground near the garage door, and [REDACTED] told me these bolts were from boat parts that were taken. [REDACTED] also told me the tool battery was not from the shed, and was most likely from the suspect. [REDACTED] also did not recognize the wires.

The West side of the building had two windows that were undisturbed. These windows opened by sliding the pane left or right and had a wire screen over the opening. These windows had three parallel bars bolted inside the window.

The North side of the building had no access into the building and no windows.

The East side of the building had one window. I observed the window was slid open, and the wire screen was pulled out from the window on three sides, allowing access inside. On closer inspection, I observed the outside of the windowsill had a muddy mark consistent with a mark left by a shoe. This window had three bars bolted across as well, and the lowest bar had a disturbance in the dirt consistent with a hand grabbing the bar. The dust on the window was smudged, consistent with an individual pushing the window open from the outside.

I also observed marks on the upright windowsill that appeared to be a handprint. Upon closer inspection, I observed a "dotted" pattern slightly larger than a fingerprint. These imprints were also left in the dust on the pane of glass of the window that was slid open. These marks are consistent with an individual wearing gloves.

On the ground outside of the East side window, I observed a long white strand of building material.

I then began my canvass of the inside of the building. I did not observe any signs of forced entry to the standard door on the south side of the building and observed no pry marks on the garage



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door.

A boat on a trailer was parked on the East side of the building, while the West side of the building had a golf cart parked. There were miscellaneous tools and other equipment attached to the walls of the building. There was a loft on the East side of the building that was full of equipment.

The floor of the building was visibly wet.

I then went to the East side window to observe the marks inside. The window was directly over a deep freezer that had a layer of mud on top. In the mud, I observed two shoe prints in the corner. These shoe prints were only portions of the shoe and had a pattern of "+" marks with a set of lines on one side. There was a large "swipe" in the dirt on top of the fridge consistent with a person sliding across the fridge.

I observed the shoe pattern travel across the floor of the building and around the boat on the trailer. On the north wall of the garage, the shoe pattern appears in a circle like pattern, consistent with a person turning in a circle in place.

██████ told me the shoe pattern was not his.

I then examined the boat on the trailer. I saw the trailer, Illinois registration ████████, registered to ████████ was a 2018 Ranger Trail.

The boat was a Ranger Z520 L, with Illinois registration ████████. The boat had one rear hatch opened and a hatch opened at the front. ████████ told me the boat's upholstery was muddier than when he left it.



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I observed the dashboard of the boat to be missing the electronic monitors. The monitors were unscrewed from the dashboard, and [REDACTED] told me the mounting bracket for them was also missing.

In the front of the boat, I observed a pair of green handled scissors next to a set of hex wrenches. There was also a cover lying on the top of the boat that had been unscrewed.

Looking into the nearby hatches I located a single hex wrench like the wrenches in the set. I also observed wires had been cut on the wiring harness inside the front of the boat.

[REDACTED] told me he did not recognize the set of hex wrenches, and also told me the scissors were his.

Underneath the garage door I located a black handle with a short length of coated cable.

[REDACTED] told me he was missing the following items:

- over 20 fishing rods/reels
- approximately \$5,000.00 in fishing lures
- 2 "hummingbird" brand monitors
- 2 "Lowrance" brand monitors
- 4 Lithium-Ion boat batteries
- 1 "Minn Kota" Trolling motor
- 1 fish net



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██████ estimated the cost of the total items taken from the boat to be approximately \$30,000.00. After going through the boat, ██████ told me the suspect took everything valuable from the boat and left anything that was not worth much, such as the life vest and throwable floatation device.

██████ told me he was in contact with the company that outfitted his boat to obtain all the serial numbers and model numbers of the items stolen. ██████ told me the electronics for the boat, when powered, could be traced by GPS. I provided ██████ my work email address to forward me the information on the items stolen.

A supplemental report will be completed when I receive the full details of the stolen items.

I photographed the scene using a Champaign County Sheriff's Office camera and later uploaded the photographs to Evidence.com. I photographed the shoe prints on the fridge and the floor alongside a photo scale. A copy of the photos is attached to this report.

I then seized the following items from the scene:

- DeWalt 12 V Lithium-Ion tool battery, located outside the garage door
- Wire connector with black (labelled "GROUND"), red (labelled "ACC+"), blue (labelled "POWER ANTENNA"), yellow (labelled "BATTERY +") wires, located outside the garage door
- Wire connector with blue (labelled "PURPLE REAR-R SPEAKER"), green (labelled "GREEN REAR-L SPEAKER"), white (labelled "WHITE FRONT-L SPEAKER"), grey (labelled "GRAY FRONT-R SPEAKER") wires, located outside the garage door
- Eklind brand hex tool kit, missing two tools, one from the 1/16 in and the other from the 5/32 in slot, located in front of boat
- Single hex key, located in front of boat
- Pull handle, "Minn Kota" brand, with short length of coated cable, located pinned under garage door



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I later packaged these items and entered them into evidence at the Champaign County Sheriff's Office.

Later that evening, I received an email from "[REDACTED]@gmail.com" to my work email with the photographs from the trail cameras. The camera times were reported accurate to within 15 minutes.

I observed multiple pictures, timestamped on 08/25/2023 from 0429-0439 hours, of a male carrying items from the building. The male is a white male with a short beard and long hair. The male was wearing a ballcap with a sleeveless t-shirt. It should be noted the trail camera captured the images in infrared. In total, there are 18 photographs from 08/25/2023.

In these photos, the male can be seen carrying a fish net and a large object consistent with a trolling motor, amongst other objects.

I also observed two photographs from 08/21/2023. The first, taken at 0046 hours, is of a dark in color pickup truck. The front of the pickup truck is consistent with an early 2000s model Chevrolet Silverado. The truck appears to have an extended cab, and the running boards alongside the cab are a tube design that extends from the cab. Due to the infrared lighting, the license plate is unreadable.

The second photo taken on 08/21/2023 is at 0132 hours. It shows a male, similar in build to the male on the photos from 08/25/2023. The male is wearing a similar ballcap and a shirt with sleeves and is holding something in his hands.

I also received a photograph from 08/16/2023 at 1830 hours. The vehicle is a blue 2023 Hyundai Kona; however, the license plate is unreadable. It is unknown if this vehicle is related to the burglary.



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These photographs have been uploaded to Evidence.com and are attached to this report.

I was unable to determine the approximate cost of the damage to the boat. Through a Google search, the boat is worth approximately \$70,000.00.

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On Tuesday, September 5, 2023, at approximately 1900 hours, I, Deputy Griffin #557, was notified by Mahomet Police Officer Brown that he located the suspect vehicle parked in the lot of Hatcher's Cars, 103 W Oak St, Mahomet. Officer Brown told me there was a male, later identified as [REDACTED] standing by the bed of the truck.

For reporting purposes, I will refer to [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] in this report.

Sgt. Darr #537 and I responded to the business to speak with [REDACTED]. We spoke with [REDACTED] in the gravel parking lot of the business. [REDACTED] was in the process of transferring tools from a black Chevrolet Silverado to a white Grand Wagoneer that [REDACTED] told me was a rental.

A search of a Law Enforcement Database showed the Chevrolet Silverado, with Illinois registration [REDACTED], was registered to [REDACTED].

I asked [REDACTED] where he was on both 08/21/2023 and 08/25/2023, and he told me he was at home in Farmer City on both nights. [REDACTED] told me he wasn't very active during the night.

I asked [REDACTED] if his truck was always with him, and she shook his head left to right. [REDACTED] told me other people drove his truck but refused to identify any other person. [REDACTED] told me his truck was broken down and needed a new transmission.

Sgt. Darr told [REDACTED] that we had him on video, and I asked him again where he was. [REDACTED] again told me he was at home.

Sgt. Darr then told [REDACTED] we were looking to get the items back, and he asked what was taken.



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Upon Sgt. Darr asking [REDACTED] where the stuff was, he told us he did not know where it was. [REDACTED] told us that someone had taken the items from him.

[REDACTED] then said, "So if it's what I'm thinkin', is it a bunch of fishing stuff?" [REDACTED] then told us he could return the items.

Sgt. Darr asked [REDACTED] if he used the Silverado in the theft and he replied, "Yes."

[REDACTED] told us he stole the items because another person drove by the property, saw that nobody lived there, and told him about the items to steal.

Sgt. Darr then produced printed copies of the images from the trail cameras on the property from a sealed manila envelope and showed them to [REDACTED]. Sgt. Darr told [REDACTED] the burglary wasn't very smart, and he replied, "I know." [REDACTED] later said, "I fucked up, I know."

I later entered the folder and the printed copies of the trail camera video into evidence at the Champaign County Sheriff's Office.

[REDACTED] told us, if he could get ahold of the other person in Farmer City, he could have the items back tonight. [REDACTED] then contacted the other party through phone, but they did not answer. [REDACTED] then showed us a text message asking the other person to call him.

[REDACTED] agreed to bring the items to the sheriff's office by 2200 hours.



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I then told [REDACTED] we were seizing the truck due to the use of the truck in the burglary. Upon closer inspection of the truck, I observed the driver's side had a step rail and the top of the cab had a visor piece attached with running lights inside. The truck was consistent with the truck in the surveillance video.

Reynold's Towing responded to impound the Truck. I later photographed the truck using a Champaign County Sheriff's Office camera. A copy of the photographs is included in this report.

I allowed [REDACTED] to get his tools out of the bed of the truck and observed him move a large plastic case labeled "DeWalt". I asked [REDACTED] why the rest of his tools were "Milwaukee" brand, and this box was "DeWalt", and he told me he was a "DeWalt" guy, and his work used "Milwaukee".

[REDACTED] then drove away in the Grand Wagoneer.

I inventoried the Silverado and located a white metal ring in a ring box in the center console. The box had a sticker on the top printed "7", and the inside had a price tag fixed to the lid of the box, listing the price as "\$229.95".

I then stood by until Reynold's Towing arrived and towed the truck.

Later that evening, at approximately 2300 hours, I called [REDACTED] for an update regarding his return of the stolen items. [REDACTED] told me he was about 15 minutes away.

At approximately 2310 hours, I met with [REDACTED] at the Sheriff's Office, and he returned a large amount of the items listed as stolen. [REDACTED] told me it took him longer than expected because he had to go to two different locations to get the items.



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While returning the items, [REDACTED] admitted to me the DeWalt battery located at the scene was his.

I observed [REDACTED] return most of the stolen items, as well as other items not previously known were stolen.

After returning the items, I asked [REDACTED] why he kept it, and he told me he was planning to outfit "the cheapest" boat he could find with them and then sell the rest.

On 10/04/2022 at approximately 1457 I, Champaign County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) Deputy C. Carlson #513, was dispatched to Applebee's restaurant at 1201 N. Dunlap Ave. in Savoy, IL for report of a stolen vehicle. The reporting person, [REDACTED] called MET CAD and advised that her silver Kia Sorento was stolen today (10/04/2022) sometime between 1000 hours and 1411 hours. This incident was captured on my AXON body worn camera. This report is a summary of the statements and events that were given to me by the individual(s) I spoke with pertaining to this incident. This report is not directly quoted unless otherwise noted. The statements in this report may or may not be in the chronological order as they were given to me. I arrived at Applebee's a short time later where I would meet [REDACTED] in the parking lot. I introduced myself to [REDACTED] and informed her I was wearing a body camera that records audio and video. I asked [REDACTED] if she could explain what occurred in reference to her Kia Sorento being stolen. [REDACTED] told me that she came to work this morning at approximately 1000 hours and was working a "double". She told me that she took her break at approximately 1411 hours and realized her car, a 2013 silver Kia Sorento bearing IL Reg. [REDACTED], had been stolen while she was inside Applebee's working. [REDACTED] stated that the Kia was parked on the west side of Applebee's in the employee parking area and that this area of the parking lot is not covered by surveillance cameras. I asked [REDACTED] if she left the Kia unlocked when she arrived at work today. [REDACTED] explained that the key fob battery for the Kia has a dead battery. [REDACTED] further explained that the Kia uses "push start", so when the key fob battery is dead she has to access a bypass switch within the center console and insert the physical key of the Kia to start it through the push button. [REDACTED] explained that when she came to work this morning, she inserted the key in the bypass and drove to work, arriving a short time later and leaving the key inserted in the bypass when she exited the vehicle and went into Applebee's to work. Breanna believes that if the key is inserted in the bypass, the Kia will not lock its doors. [REDACTED] did not suspect anyone in particular of the stealing the Kia, stating no one has "beef" with her. [REDACTED] has not given permission to anyone to drive the Kia. I asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] was aware the Kia was stolen, to which she stated he is. I collected [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] contact information at this time. I advised [REDACTED] of the evidence collecting process should the Kia be located. [REDACTED] wished the Kia to be processed. This concluded my initial contact with [REDACTED]. I placed a phone call to [REDACTED] the registered owner of the stolen Kia. [REDACTED] advised he was aware the Kia was stolen. Michael stated that no one besides [REDACTED] has permission to drive the Kia. [REDACTED] told me he does not suspect anyone of stealing the Kia and stated most people probably would not know he owns it (Kia). I advised [REDACTED] of the evidence collection process, should the Kia be located. [REDACTED] wished to have the vehicle processed for evidence. [REDACTED] told me that if the Kia is located, we could call him or [REDACTED] for pickup. This concluded my phone call with [REDACTED]. Upon returning to my patrol vehicle, I utilized a law enforcement database to search "BM50233", the affixed registration on the stolen Kia. I observed that the Kia was in the area of Curtis Rd. and Dunlap Ave., Savoy (near Applebee's) at approximately 1336 hours and in the area of Kenwood Rd. and John St. Champaign at approximately 1429 hours. This would indicate the Kia being stolen just prior to 1336 hours. I collected images from this database and submitted them to the AXON Evidence Server for storage, copies of each are attached to this report for viewing. I then traveled to numerous apartment complexes in the Kenwood Rd. / Springfield Ave. area to search for the Kia, but was unable to locate it. After unsuccessful attempts at locating the Kia, I traveled to the Champaign County Satellite Jail to enter the Kia into LEADS as stolen. I annotated on the LEADS entry form that the Kia has two decals in the rearmost window. One decal is a white in color circle that is peeling in the upper left corner of the window. The other decal reads "Love is Blind" and is located in the lower right hand corner of the rear window. Lastly, I annotated that if the Kia is located, to hold it for latent fingerprints and DNA samples. I was provided LEADS # [REDACTED]. I have attached a copy of the LEADS confirmation to this report for viewing. At approximately 1725 hours I traveled back to Applebee's. There, I met with [REDACTED] and a manager to inquire on the security camera on the south side of the building that views the parking lot. I was informed that the only surveillance cameras owned by Applebee's that record are in the dining area. The exterior camera I observed only provides a "live view". This concluded my contact at Applebee's. I noted that the First Bank and Trust, located to the west / north west of Applebee's has surveillance cameras that may point toward the west parking lot at Applebee's. I will follow up with them during business hours. No suspect information is available at this time. I did not review any portion of my AXON Body Worn Camera footage prior to, or during, the authoring of this report. Nothing further at this time.

On 10/7/22 at 1211 hrs, I responded to 1211 S. Mattis (Little Caesars Pizza), Champaign, in reference to a recovered stolen vehicle that was taken from 1201 Dunlap (Applebee's), Savoy, that occurred on 10/4/22 at 1410 hrs. Please see Deputy Carlson's #513, original report. This incident was captured by my AXON department issued camera. This report is a summary of the statements and events that were given to me by the individual(s) I spoke to pertaining to this incident. This report is not directly quoted unless otherwise specified. The statements in this report may or may not be in chronological order as they were given to me. I did not review my body camera recording prior to authoring this report. Upon arrival I met with several Champaign City Police Officers and the registered owner of the stolen vehicle, [REDACTED]. I advised [REDACTED] that this contact was being recorded with audio and video equipment. I advised the CPD Officers that they could leave, and I would complete the processing of the vehicle. Reynold's towing was already on scene per the request of [REDACTED] because he didn't have a spare key to drive his vehicle home. I asked Michael what occurred, and he essentially stated the following: His girlfriend, [REDACTED] who drives his vehicle had driven it to Applebee's for work and it had been stolen from that location. [REDACTED] advised that today he was out driving around when he observed his vehicle to be parked in the parking lot of 1207 S. Mattis, directly behind Little Caesars Pizza. He approached the vehicle and noticed that it was empty and then called 911 to report that he had located the vehicle. I walked up to [REDACTED] vehicle, a Silver 2013 Kia, bearing IL # [REDACTED]. I attempted the door, and it was locked. I asked [REDACTED] if he would like me to process the vehicle and if so, I would need to gain entry to his vehicle. [REDACTED] advised he would like the vehicle processed but did not have an extra key to open it. I asked the Reynold's driver if he could make entry into the vehicle. He advised he could and was able to open the driver's door without touching it with his bare hands. I opened all the doors and asked [REDACTED] if he could look into the interior and see if there was anything that didn't belong to him. [REDACTED] looked into the vehicle and advised that from what he can see there is nothing out of the usual except two bottles of alcohol that were sitting in the baby's car seat. Michael advised that his girlfriend [REDACTED] was on her way, and she would be able to verify anything that is located in the vehicle. [REDACTED] arrived on scene and checked the interior of the vehicle and stated that everything in the vehicle, including the alcohol belongs to her. At this time, I processed the vehicle using DNA swabs. I swabbed the following areas of the vehicle: The driver's door lock button (inside) The driver's door handle. The steering wheel. The gear shifter. The driver's seat belt clip/holder. The vehicle's stereo knob. The vehicle's glove compartment handle. I asked [REDACTED] if he would submit to a DNA swab. [REDACTED] swabbed the inside of his left and right cheek. I asked [REDACTED] if she would submit to a DNA swab. [REDACTED] swabbed the inside of her left and right cheek. All the DNA swabs were placed into their original plastic containers and will be sent to the state lab for further testing. After processing the vehicle, I released the vehicle to [REDACTED] where he was going to have it towed back to his residence. I observed on the side of the building where the vehicle was parked had outside video cameras. I went into the building where there are several small businesses located. I spoke with one of the owners and I was informed that the cameras do not work. The last owner of the building that owned the cameras left the building in August. No further at this time.
