Subject: Automatic License Plate Reader Program Evaluation

Summary:

The information provided in this report is dedicated to outlining the effectiveness of the Department's Automatic License Plate Reader (ALPR) program. Based on the information contained herein, it is recommended that the Department and City consider purchasing additional ALPRs and other technology related to the program.

Background:

The purchase of 46 Falcon Automatic License Plate Readers (ALPRs) from Flock Group, Inc. was authorized by Council on December 21, 2021 (CB2021-178). The purchase and implementation of the ALPRs was in response to a significant increase in violent crime, focusing largely on gun violence, which had steadily increased since 2013. The term of the agreement with Flock was for two years, which did not commence until the last ALPR was installed on January 24, 2023.

The Department developed the recommended locations for the 46 ALPRs in consultation with a Flock representative. The deployment plan included analyzing five (5) years of data on shooting incidents and associated locations. The primary goal of the ALPR location recommendations was to provide adequate coverage to the neighborhoods most frequently affected by gun violence. ALPRs were located outside of the neighborhoods most frequently affected by gun violence, not within them. Preliminary deployment plans focused on arterial streets and the routes most likely to be traveled by those committing acts of gun violence. ALPRs were also designated for major entry and exit points to the city.

ALPRs can be relocated based on changes in crime trends so that the technology can be best positioned to have a meaningful impact on areas of the community experiencing the highest levels of violence and crime. However, there is a relocation fee for each move, and relocations can require several weeks to months to complete. An ALPR assigned for relocation can remain operational in its current location until being relocated. To date, the Department has not relocated any ALPRs, and is not recommending any relocations at this time.

ALPR Policy and Training:

Police Department ALPR training for sworn and civilian staff coincided with the launch of the ALPR program on May 4, 2022. In advance of the ALPR program's launch, information was disseminated to staff, which included the Police Department policy, procedures, and information pertaining to the

required training on the ALPR program. As stated in policy, training was required prior to ALPR use by any personnel.

Most staff received training during four training sessions offered from May 4 through May 12, 2022. The training was presented to staff by a Flock Group, Inc. trainer and Police Department ALPR administrators. The ALPR policy's language related to ALPR use was read and reiterated to staff by Police Department ALPR Administrators. At that time, Police Department Administrators also provided clarifying instruction, which advised staff that ALPRs could only be used for criminal offenses for which they would make a custodial arrest.

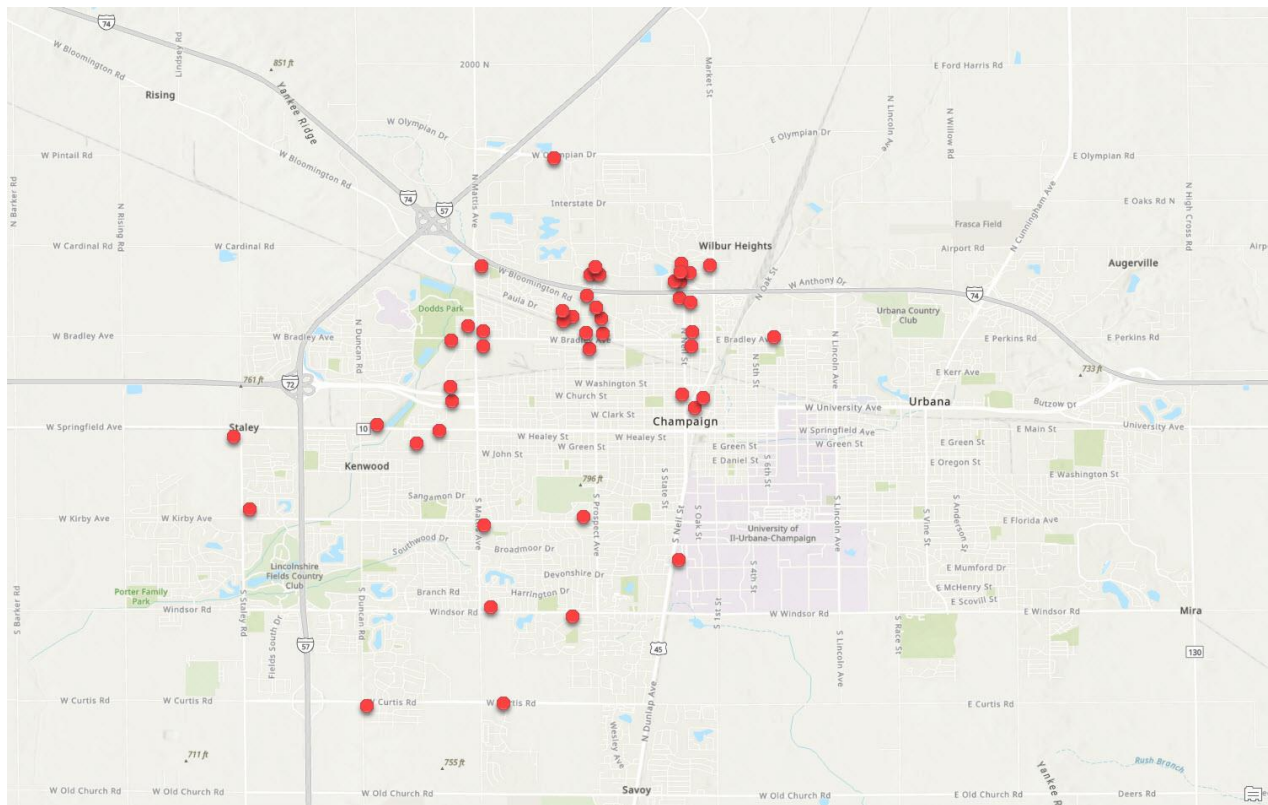
All new Police Department staff with access to ALPRs receive ALPR training during the field training program. Flock Group, Inc. also offers instructional videos and training support for users through its webpage.

ALPR Program Evaluation:

In April 2023, a working group, which consisted of patrol officers, detectives, and administration, was established to evaluate and make recommendations on the ALPR program. The working group agreed that the implementation of the ALPR program has served as a valuable investigative resource for the Department. The group identified locations where ALPRs should be considered, with the initial list recommending 113 new ALPR locations. The recommendations sought to fill coverage gaps in some of the cities on heavily traveled streets adjacent to high-crime areas and side streets known to be regularly used by offenders to avoid law enforcement. The group also placed an emphasis on positioning additional ALPRs in the Downtown Business District. Upon reviewing and discussing the recommended locations, that list was narrowed to 79 new ALPRs.

Falcon ALPR Purchase and Installation Costs:

The current cost for one Falcon ALPR is \$3,000 annually. However, Flock is currently offering a discount to existing customers through the end of 2023. If the Department were to purchase additional ALPRs and sign a five-year contract with Flock, all newly leased Falcon ALPRs would be \$2,500 annually, the original cost to lease the existing ALPRs. For 79 ALPRs, the \$500 discount would be a savings of \$39,500 annually, or \$197,500 over five years. The discount is for Falcon ALPRs and is not extended to any other products.

The installation cost of a Falcon ALPR is determined by location and IDOT permitting requirements. An ALPR requiring an IDOT permit is \$1,900, while all others are \$650. The relocation fees mimic the installation cost schedule.

ALPR Investigative Effectiveness:

ALPRs have been utilized regularly by Department staff as an investigative tool, assisting with the resolution of numerous incidents and criminal offenses. For the purposes of this report, resolved incidents are defined as those resulting in an arrest, recovered property, an investigative lead related to an ongoing investigation that would not have otherwise been available, or the final disposition or resolution of a call for service. ALPR successes are reported to Police Administration for reporting purposes. The most notable successes include arrests for homicide, reckless discharge and/or aggravated discharge of a firearm, weapons offenses, and arson, which are highlighted below:

On Wednesday, May 11, 2022, officers were dispatched to the 2400 block of Chiswick Drive for the report of shots fired. One of the two male subjects displayed a firearm, fired four rounds into the air, and then both subjects fled the scene. Detectives developed a suspect from witness statements and social media evidence and determined that a vehicle associated with the suspect was captured in the area on an ALPR near the time of the shooting. The suspect was arrested following the issuance of an arrest warrant and is awaiting trial.

On Tuesday, May 24, 2022, the Champaign Fire Department (CFD) responded to the 800 block of Centennial Drive for a fire. CFD suspected arson due to evidence located at the scene. This arson and one occurring in the same block on March 3, 2022, and one occurring in Rantoul were all determined to be linked by the assigned detective. Utilizing ALPRs, the detective was able to place the suspect's vehicle in the area of the Champaign arson incidents and multiple arsons occurring in other jurisdictions. The suspect was arrested and is awaiting trial.

On Sunday, June 19, 2022, officers responded to the 900 block of Bloomington Road for a shooting with injuries. A large group had gathered in the area, and three persons were struck by gunfire. Of those, one person succumbed to his injuries. Two vehicles of interest were captured on private video surveillance, which provided detectives with an investigative lead. Detectives were able to identify the vehicle registration number using ALPRs in the area, ultimately leading to the identification of witnesses and the suspect. Additionally, on June 30, 2022, members of the Street Crimes Task Force (SCTF) were assisting with locating and arresting homicide suspect. Detectives conducted an ALPR search based on the make and color of a different vehicle known to be driven by the suspect, and the vehicle and suspect were located. During the suspect's arrest, a handgun was recovered. The suspect was arrested and is awaiting trial for homicide.

On Saturday, August 27, 2022, officers responded to the 700 block of North Neil Street for a shooting with injuries. The victim was transported to a local hospital for treatment but succumbed to his injuries. The suspect and the suspect's vehicle were captured on private video surveillance, but the identity of the suspect and registration of the vehicle were unknown. Detectives utilized ALPRs to identify the registration number of the vehicle which led to the identification of the offender. The suspect was located hours later utilizing ALPRs and was arrested with a firearm on his person less than 24 hours following the incident. The suspect is awaiting trial for homicide.

On Sunday, October 16, 2022, officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of South Randolph Street for the report of shots fired. Officers learned the suspect brandished and fired a pistol during a domestic dispute inside a multi-unit residence. The fired round penetrated multiple walls and the ceiling in the direction of another apartment. A casing and bullet projectile were recovered from inside the residence, and the firearm was found hidden outside the residence. The suspect was not located on that date.

Using ALPRs, an officer located and arrested the suspect on October 21, 2022, when he returned to the area of the residence. The suspect was arrested and is awaiting trial for multiple felony charges.

On Wednesday, October 19, 2022, officers were dispatched to the 2300 block of Sangamon Drive for a report of a shooting with injuries. Upon arrival, officers located a 12-year-old male victim in a vehicle with life-threatening gunshot wounds to the neck. The victim had been riding with a family member when the driver determined they were being followed. When the family member attempted to identify the driver of the suspect vehicle, the suspect stopped, produced a firearm, and opened fire, striking the victim vehicle and surrounding homes multiple times and wounding the victim. The driver of the victim vehicle had been unable to identify the suspect vehicle, but ALPRs captured the suspect vehicle before and after the shooting, leading to the identification and ultimate arrest of the suspect on January 31, 2023. The suspect remains awaiting trial for the charge of attempted homicide.

On Friday, November 4, 2022, officers were dispatched to Bradley Avenue at Elm Street for a report of a shooting with injuries. Private video surveillance captured several vehicles of interest in the area around the time of the homicide. Detectives reviewed ALPRs and identified the vehicle registrations of witness and suspect vehicles. The suspect vehicle was then able to be located, yielding the location of additional witnesses and private video surveillance. The subsequent interviews of those additional witnesses and video led to the identification and arrest of two suspects on December 14, 2022. Both suspects remain awaiting trial for homicide.

On Wednesday, December 14, 2022, officers responded to the 1300 block of Duncan Road for a house fire. The tenant of the residence was suspected of starting a fire in the attic of the residence. Hours later, the same suspect committed a burglary and an attempted arson at a business in the 1900 block of West Springfield Avenue. The suspect departed the scene before officers could locate him. The suspect then attempted a burglary at a business in the 100 block of East Green Street. Officers used ALPRs to locate the suspect's vehicle, leading to his arrest that day.

On Monday, January 9, 2023, officers responded to the 10 block of Apricot Lane for the report of shots fired. Officers determined that no persons had been struck, but there was evidence of gunfire located at the scene. Officers reviewed surveillance video to identify the make and color of the suspect vehicle. Using ALPRs, officers identified the suspect's vehicle's registration, which aided their efforts in locating the suspect vehicle an hour later. Shell casings and live ammunition were located inside the suspect vehicle, and one suspect was arrested on an outstanding arrest upon exiting the residence where the suspect vehicle was located. This remains an ongoing investigation.

On Thursday, April 20, 2023, a female subject was abducted in Champaign and sexually assaulted. The offender, a truck driver, drove the victim to Iroquois County, where he released her handcuffed and naked. The victim provided a vague description of the semi-truck and trailer. Detectives used ALPRs to identify the semi-truck registration and the offender based on the locations of the events as provided by the victim. The suspect is pending apprehension following the issuance of an arrest warrant for Kidnapping and Sexual Assault.

On Friday, June 9, 2023, officers assisted the Decatur Police Department with locating two prolific thieves that had several outstanding cases in Decatur, Jacksonville, Illinois, and Iowa City, Iowa. ALPRs assisted with locating the suspect vehicle and the hotel they were staying at in Champaign. Search warrants were obtained for two hotel rooms and the suspect vehicle. A male and female subject were arrested on charges of Money Laundering, Burglary, and Aggravated Identify Theft, as well as an out-of-state arrest warrant.

On Monday, July 3, 2023, officers responded to the 300 block of East University Avenue for the report of shots fired. Officers learned the victim had been robbed of a large sum of money and shot at by two offenders following a recent withdrawal at a local financial institution. Detectives used ALPRs to identify the suspect vehicle, which had followed the victim from the financial institution to the location of the robbery. The suspects are pending apprehension following the issuance of an arrest warrant for Armed Robbery and Aggravated Assault.

On Monday, July 3, 2023, officers responded to the 2500 block of West Springfield Avenue for a check welfare call for service. Once on the scene, officers located a 27-year-old Champaign male unresponsive inside an apartment from an apparent gunshot wound. The victim's vehicle was determined to have been taken during the homicide. Detectives used ALPRs to locate the victim's vehicle and subsequently identify the suspect's vehicle. Surveillance video of the suspect was also then able to be identified. Additional investigative information was also garnered by identifying a vehicle the victim met up with prior to the homicide. The suspect is pending apprehension following the issuance of an arrest warrant for Homicide.

A table documenting ALPR successes is attached at the end of this report as Attachment A. While these are the reported successes, they may not be all-inclusive and do not include incidents involving open investigations. Overall, ALPRs have proven extremely useful in tracking, documenting, and locating witnesses and suspects during criminal investigations.

Additional ALPR Options:

The Department will be purchasing 42 Axon in-car cameras for the patrol fleet pursuant to direction from Council. The in-car cameras purchased will be the Fleet 3 model camera, which integrates with Flock's ALPR technology. Implementing that ALPR technology within the Fleet 3 camera would immediately result in more ALPRs on city streets, which would result in more license plate reads, a better tool for officers responding to a crime, and follow-up on investigations. These ALPRs could also serve as a movable ALPR for short-term use. The licensing fee per in-car camera would be \$49.00 per month per vehicle or \$ 24,696 annually for all 42 vehicles. The Department recommends purchasing the licensing to activate the ALPR in all 42 vehicles.

Additionally, Flock offers a location-flexible ALPR, the Falcon Flex. The portability of the Falcon Flex would allow the Department to immediately change the location of an ALPR as deemed necessary to address emerging criminal activity or new hotspots. The Falcon Flex operates on a rechargeable battery that is readily deployable for temporary installations. The Falcon Flex has a read capacity of approximately 30,000-40,000 reads, with an operating time of up to one week before requiring a recharge. The cost per Falcon Flex is \$3,500 annually. The Department recommends purchasing five Falcon Flexes, a total annual cost of \$17,500.

Conclusion:

The Department's ALPR program has proven to be a valuable investigative tool. From its inception, the Department has recognized that there were several areas that would benefit from the presence of ALPRs, as several arterial roads and neighborhoods impacted by higher crime rates could not receive ALPRs. The City of Champaign, its residents and visitors, and the Department would benefit from the program's expansion.
